Redistricting Commission of Ohio:

Historically, both parties have been guilty of gerrymandering, and no matter which party does it, it undermines our democracy. With today's advanced technology, though, computer programs can be so precise that the resulting gerrymandered districts are extremely effective, and many times more detrimental to our democracy than gerrymandering of the past.
