- Not acting to reduce agricultural pollution of Lake Erie.
- And on and on and on

Thanks in no small part to the poorly performing and gerrymandered General Assembly, Ohio ranks a pitiful 36th of all 50 states in the *U.S. News and World Report* state ranking, which takes into account healthcare, education, economy, infrastructure, opportunity, fiscal stability, crime and corrections, and natural environment. And it ranks 44 in the category of natural environment, which is comprised of air/water quality and pollution.

Enough. Ohio deserves better. Gerrymandered districts have been harmful to Ohio, and the practice should be discontinued.
